He gathers them all together in Miletus and he shares with them everything that is on his heart. It is, in essence, a farewell address because he doesn't believe that he will see them again. He gives them a message were you can see the love of Paul for others and his zealousness for God coalesce. Paul encourages them to be alert. To be alert over the people of God in Christ. They are to be alert against false teaching. He also encourages them to have right conduct toward other another. As leaders, the people should be able to trust in their leaders to instruct them in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Elders are to provide good instruction and care for those in need.

Even though you might not be an elder, the need to be alert is important for all of us. What does it mean to be alert in regards to our own faith?

Paul stresses the importance of right belief and right action.
